Having no particular Australian style (except perhaps meat pies and roast lamb) restaurants have adapted herbs and spices, fruit and vegetables from around the world into a unique fusion called modern Australian cuisine. Anything goes and eating is an adventure. This IABC Dine-around is not fine dining, it's fun dining (with good food).

Here are your choices.

1. Garfish Manly (Limited to 8 people) – a seafood experience
2. Pub Crawl around the rocks with a chance to try crocodile and Kangaroo
3. Kansai Japanese in the heart of Sydney
4. Harry's Cafe de Wheels – a unique Sydney pie experience
5. The Deck – Modern Australian food with sweeping harbour views

Option One

Garfish Manly – Booking for 8

Include in your planning a refreshing trip on the Fast Ferry from Circular Quay to Manly. Ferry's leave at 18.10 hours or 18.40 hours from Circular Quay Wharf 6. Tickets are \$6.40 per trip and can be purchased on the ferry

Option Two

Pub food Crawl around Sydney's historical Rocks area

Pub can be unpredictable, but this is a chance to experience historical Sydney at its best. Join your colleagues for a pub crawl around Sydney's unique Rocks area. Pub food is sometimes surprising but always cheap and cheerful. Wear your walking shoes and dress smart casual.

Start at Pub 1 - Fortune of War; 137 George Street

Cosy, wood-accented pub built in 1828, offering bistro and bar food, plus live bands and solo acts.

Pub 2 - The Orient Hotel, George Street

1840s pub with chic lounge areas and a leafy courtyard

Pub 3 - The Mercantile 25 George St, The Rocks Sydney

In a redbrick building dating from 1914, this is a casual, Irish-style hotel – reported one of the longest running 'Irish' hotels in Sydney

Pub 4 - The Hero of Waterloo 81 Lower Fort St., Millers Point

The Hero of Waterloo has provided more than 160 years of good cheer to Sydney visitors and locals. Live music, award-winning food, ghost tours and a heritage landmark classification make this convict-built hotel a must see. The bar and restaurant offer a lively atmosphere and if you're lucky you may even meet the famous ghost of Anne Kirkman.

And to finish off....

Pub 5 - The Lord Nelson Brewery 19 Kent St, The Rocks

One of Sydney's oldest continually licensed hotels, located in the historic Rocks precinct and home of Australia's oldest pub brewery.

Option three

Kansai Japanese

b1/7-13 Hunter St, Sydney NSW 2000

An all-you-can-eat buffet featuring sushi, tempura and udon, plus hot pots and sashimi à la carte.



Option Four

Harry's Cafe de Wheels

Corner Cowper Wharf Roadway, & Brougham Road, Woolloomooloo,

Harry's Cafe de Wheels is an iconic pie cart located in Woolloomooloo, Sydney, New South Wales, Australia on Cowper Wharf Road, near the Finger Wharf and Fleet Base East of Garden Island Navy Base, opposite the Woolloomooloo Bay Hotel.

Harry's Café de Wheels is over 70 years old and has maintained a tradition of daily fresh deliveries of its pies. In fact, it has developed a range of pies and pasties with respect to the traditions of the past.

This is VERY casual eating but an experience you can only have in Sydney. After eating choice of pie, the group will head to the Woolloomooloo Bay Hotel.



Option Five

The Deck 1 Olympic Dr, Milsons Point NSW 2061

Booking is for 10 people



This is modern Australian eating with a sensational view. Expect to pay \$18-20 for entrees and \$30-\$40 for main course.

Situated on the water at Milsons Point, The Deck restaurant embraces expansive views across the water spanning from the Opera House, Harbour Bridge, Circular Quay and Botanical Gardens.

The Deck Sydney features a stylish bar and variety of dining options including banquette lounges, traditional seating, communal tables and dining on the outdoor terrace. The venue is perfect for sharing small plates with friends, celebrating special occasions and group functions.

Catch the ferry across from the Sydney CBD, or the train from Wynyard Station to Milsons Point.
